Alertness was the big weapon College Park used Friday night to churn out a hard earned 13-6 victory over rough Douglas County for their second regional 4AA victory.

The first score came early in the first quarter when the Rams blocked an attempted Douglas County punt in the end zone and big guard James Wallace fell on it for a quick six points. The attempted extra point was inches wide and College Park had an early six point lead.

Douglas County marched right back sparked by workhorse Charlie House and tied it up. They attempted to run the extra point and were stopped cold by the C.P. "wall"

Late in the second quarter Douglas County again fumbled and the ever present James Wallace again came up with the ball to set up the Ram's next and last touchdown of the game.

Quarterback Tommy Wallace called upon Ward Akins, Richard Bolton, and speedy halfback Kim Gabrels for the yards needed to chinch a win. The backs hit Douglas County's line time and again for yard after yard and finally a Wallace to Gabrels pass put the Rams at the Douglas County four yard line. Gabrels stepped over the remaining four yards for the T.D. Charles Akins put the pigskin straight through the uprights for the Pat with only a few seconds left in the first half.

The Rams came back in the second half determined to hold on to their seven point lead and that is just what they did. The line led by Robert Griffin, Charles Akins, James Wallace, and Robert Harike never gave the Douglas County team a chance to get into scoring distance. Each time the quarterback rolled out for a pass or run he found himself bottled up by Blue and White jerseys.

The ball exchanged hands several times during the second half but there was no scoring. It appeared to be the night for the line to howl and howl they did.
